





### October is Respect Life Month

This month shines a light on two principles of Catholic Social Teaching: the preferential for the poor and the sacredness of all human life. Respecting all life means concern for the lives of the unborn, and for human life in all ages and stages. As Pope Francis states in Gaudete et Exsultate #10 “equally sacred are the lives of the poor, those already born.” We are called to respect the poor, the hungry, the homeless, the prisoner, the refugee, and the undocumented. To promote respect for life means working for the fundamentals of a dignified life, such as access to health care, affordable housing, quality education, and an environment protected for future generations. We are called to work for the common good—to enhance human life and ensure that the dignity of life is always respected.

## From Fr. Russ

**“Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God.”**



A very appropriate gospel for us to hear this 29<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time. October is Respect Life in the Catholic Church – not just respect for the unborn, but for all life! Now when one makes that “blanket” statement, some will conclude they are emphasizing the abortion issue whilst ignoring the rest – poverty, racism, domestic violence, greed, immigration, etc. But **that conclusion** can also become dismissive of the abortion issue. The number of abortions performed world-wide (42 million) in 2019 is a staggering figure. A commentary in the National Catholic Register by retired Moral Theologian Janet E. Smith, Ph.D., (10/9/20) noted that “...nearly 62 million babies have been aborted in the United States since 1973... Vastly more babies died because of abortion than those who have died in all wars since the Civil War... The numbers... mask the tragedy of particular individual women who often out of desperation submit to procedures that kill their babies... [The unborn] have the right to life [and we need to be the charity] to women who need our help...

Mother Teresa of Calcutta maintained in her lifetime that “Any country that accepts abortion is not teaching its people to love, but to use any violence to get what it wants... What is taking place in America is a war against the child. And if we accept that the mother can kill her own child, how can we tell other people not to kill one another?” (Feb. 1997 – National Prayer Breakfast in Washington attended by the President and First Lady) There is a deep spiritual truth to Mother Teresa’s statements about abortion and they are not smokescreens enabled to ignore the other societal ills of our times . As Jesus’ disciples, we obliged to defend life from conception until natural death and be very mindful of our charitable works towards the less fortunate. If we oppose abortion, then do we support pro-life organizations whose main focus is to support unfortunate women who find themselves in the position of an unexpected pregnancy? There are many pro-life organizations “out there” fortunate folks could support. These organizations can support women caught up in domestic violence and poverty often times with nowhere or nobody to turn.

As Catholics we are obliged to participate in forming a better world, not a perfect world but a better world. Perfection awaits us in heaven. It is our civic duty to work for the common good in our society but, more importantly as disciples of Jesus, to form our conscience and **“repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God.”** The gospel of Christ must always be our guide in this life - not what the media and celebrities pound us with. As Jesus was given the Roman coin in today’s gospel he referenced the image of Caesar “stamped” on the coin. The second half of Jesus’ statement reminds us in whose “image” human life is truly stamped.

**CONVERSION HAPPENS WHEN. . . .**

- . . . the Word of God comes alive and begins to transform our life.
- . . . we move from knowing the facts to knowing what these facts mean.
- . . . we move from reading the Bible as a newspaper to recognizing God’s Word in our life.
- . . . we notice God’s action in ordinary events of life.
- . . . we connect our life stories with Scripture stories and when biblical heroes become our companions on the journey.
- . . . we allow God’s Word to change us, direct us and fill our hearts with hope and peace.
- . . . we change from keeping the minimum requirements (10 commandments) to being a beatitude person, limited only by how great is our love.
- . . . we change from relating to God as a powerful force to having a warm personal relationship through prayer.

**Communion Distribution**

## Socially Distant Trunk or Treat

### Saturday, October 24, Following the 4:00 Mass

Mark your calendars for in-person Trunk or Treating this year! A few extra safety precautions will be added this year to help us keep our event as safe as possible. We will not have any indoor activities or our usual pizza supper, but we will have trunk or treating.

#### *Handing out treats?*

All participants must wear a mask and maintain social distancing of 6 ft.

Reserve a space for your car in advance on our parish website or via Flocknote.

We'll mark the parking lot in advance so cars are spaced out appropriately.

Plan ahead for your treat distribution. Consider bringing a small table to set treats on or get creative with tongs, tubes, or costume gloves for handing out treats. Consider non-edible treats

#### *Bringing your kids?*

All participants (ages 2 years and over) must wear a mask.

"Slime" hand sanitizing stations will be set up at the beginning and end of the trunk-or-treating route. There will be designated entrance and route to follow through the parking lot to get to each trunk to help space out trick or treaters.

Stay together with your group, split larger families into small groups.

Limit of one family at a time at each vehicle.

Use wide-mouth buckets or bags that are easy to drop treats into.

As with all events during the pandemic, if you are not feeling well or have been exposed to a known case of COVID-19, please stay home. If your child needs to miss out of the fun due to high risk family members, please contact the parish office so we can plan for a contactless surprise from the youth ministry office.
